The trails are named after geologic features or historic icons in Texas, and each connects a handful of wineries together for you to visit without feeling rushed. These trails explore each region of Texas, from the beaches in the south, the piney woods in the east, the quaint Old World towns in the beautiful Hill Country, to the rugged landscapes in West Texas.



## TRAIL NAMES

Balcones Trail in central Texas, Brazos Trail in southeast Texas, Enchanted Trail in central Texas, Highland Trail in central Texas, Munson Trail in northeast Texas, Palo Duro Trail in northwest Texas, Pecos Trail in southwest Texas, and the Tarantula Trail in northeast Texas.

## WINERIES

There are currently 50+ wineries in Texas. The largest concentrations of wineries are in the Hill Country and northeast Texas between Dallas and the Red River. The majority of vineyards, however, are in West Texas, where climate and a relatively pest free environment allow the grapes to thrive.
